Indore: The city is going to shine on world map as host to the two-day South Asian Speakers' Summit under aegis of Lok Sabha Speaker Sumitra Mahajan on theme of 'Achieving Sustainable Development Goals' is going to roll-out from Saturday. The presiding officers of Parliament from Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Maldives, Nepal and Sri Lanka are attending the summit.
